

Carol Williams

British born composer and international concert solo organist, Carol is Artistic Director Spreckels Organ Society and of the Lynchburg International Organ Festival, Organist in Residence at the Court St United Methodist Church in Lynchburg, VA. She could read music before English. Carol began her training at the Royal Academy of Music. Awarded all major prizes for organ. Became a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists, a Fellow of Trinity College London, and an Associate of the Royal College of Music. Carol studied in Paris with Daniel Roth. In 1995 Williams undertook postgraduate studies at Yale University with Professor Thomas Murray, appointed Chapel Organist and awarded an Artist Diploma (AD) and the Charles Ives prize for outstanding achievement. Became an Associate Organist at the Cathedral of the Incarnation in Long Island's Garden City. Earned a Doctorate of Musical Arts with Professor McNeil Robinson, Manhattan School of Music and received the Helen Cohn award for her D.M.A. San Diego's Civic Organist 2001-2016.
